I also found a pygmy pipehorse east of sea horse rock. I think that we all did at least 60 minutes on this dive. Unfortunately, Jason and Rox's camera housing leaked and they had to cut short their dive in a vain attempt to save the camera (it died).

Kelly and I spent about 55 minutes on the dive, with whales singing so loudly we were sure we were going to see them underwater (we didn't). A very nice, easy dive, suitable for when southerly winds make boat diving unavailable.

For those who are not aware, SCAN stands for the Scuba Clubs Association of NSW and this group is made up of the majority of independent clubs in NSW. That is clubs who have no affiliation with any dive shops or any other commercial diving organizations.

#### OTHER NEWS

### **Public Liability Insurance**

The club purchased a Public Liability insurance policy with QBE commencing on 30th September. Please be reminded that our public liability insurance does NOT cover members whilst they are scuba diving. The policy covers the club for liability arising from activities such as BBQ's, meetings and the newsletter. The policy also fulfills our obligations under the Incorporations Act.

### **ACMA Protection zones**

As you may recall, in July 2007 the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) declared two protection zones off the Sydney coast. Within the protection zones, certain activities that present a potential risk of causing damage to a cable are restricted or prohibited.

Both protection zones will commence on 1 October 2007 as follows:

- 1) The Northern Sydney Protection Zone, extending from Narrabeen Beach to 40 nautical miles offshore covering northern branches of the Australia Japan Cable and the Southern Cross Cable and including the area between these branches; and
- 2) The Southern Sydney Protection Zone, extending from Tamarama and Clovelly Beaches and extending 30 nautical miles offshore covering the southern branches of the Australia Japan Cable and Southern Cross Cable and including the area between these branches.

Attached to the newsletter is a copy of the Sydney Submarine Cable Protection Zones information brochure. Full details of the zones are contained in the zone Declarations and accompanying Explanatory Statements. Copies of these documents, as well as maps and zone coordinates, are available on the ACMA website can (www.acma.gov/au/subcables) or be obtained bv calling 1300 856 337.
