For those who were unable to come, the club's Christmas party was a great success, and many thanks must go to all those who helped in the preparations.

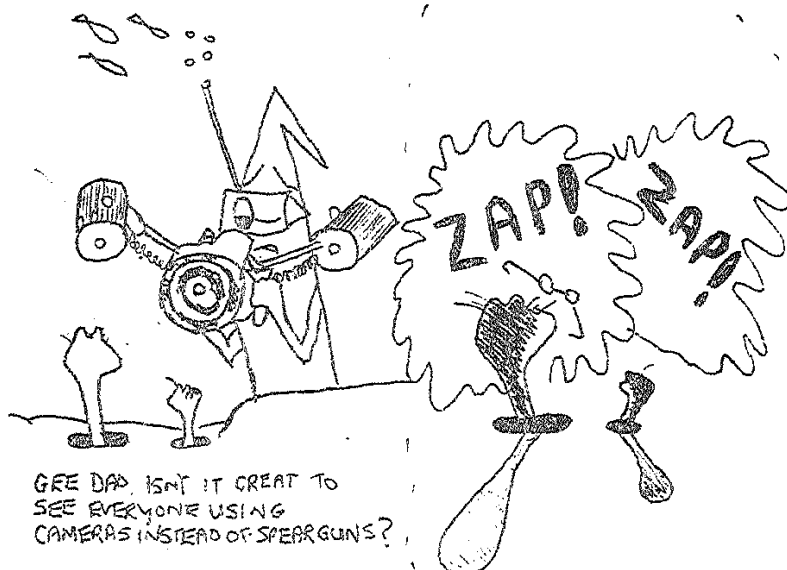
CLUB T-SHIRTS.

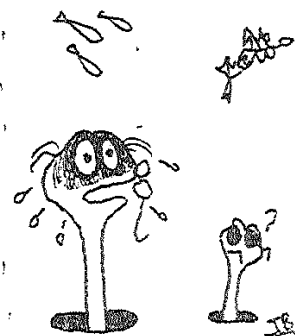

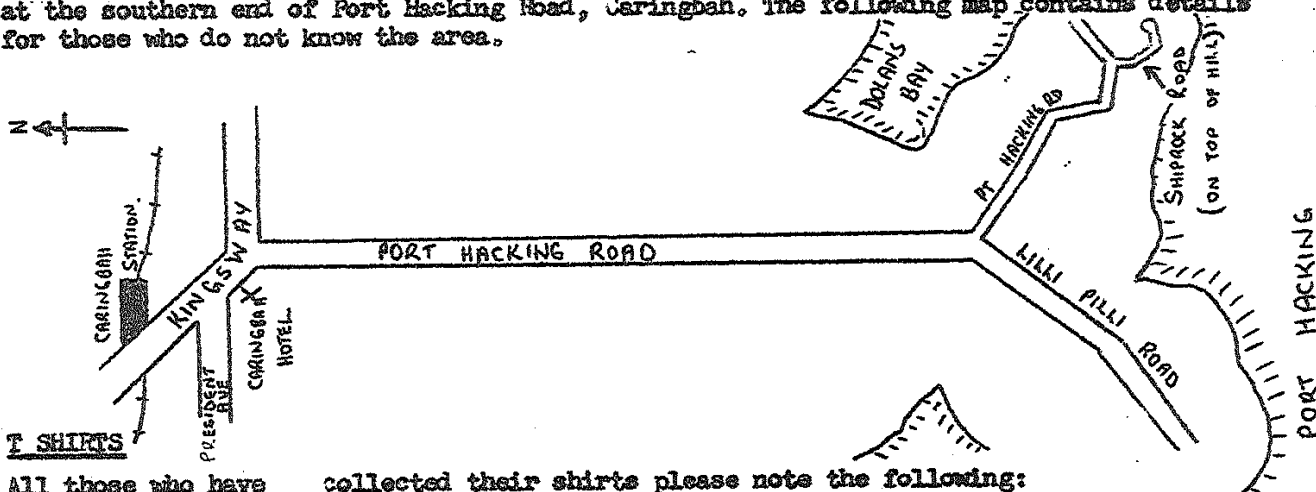
CLUB ACTIVITIES FOR FEBRUARY, 1976

DIVES

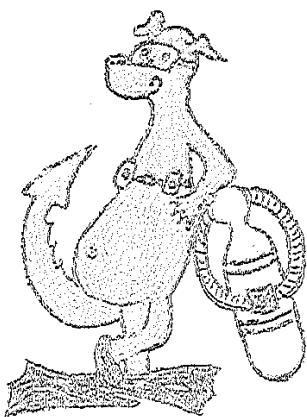

T-SHIRTS

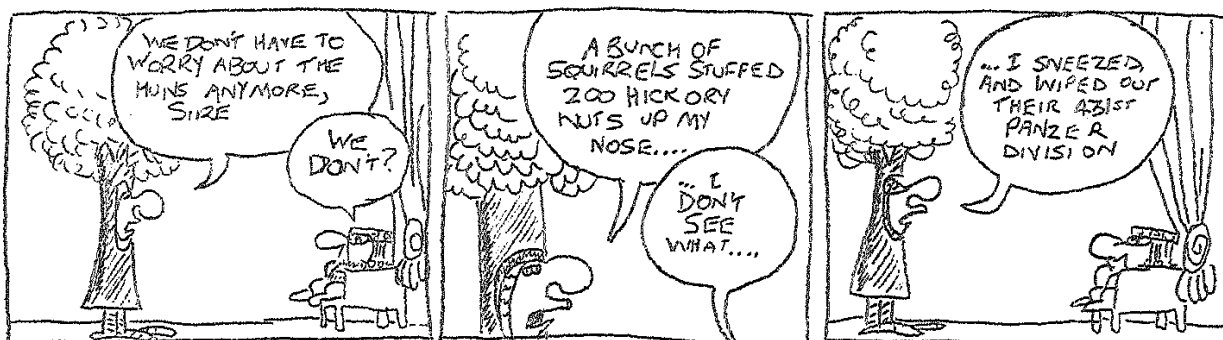

BOWLING COMPETITION

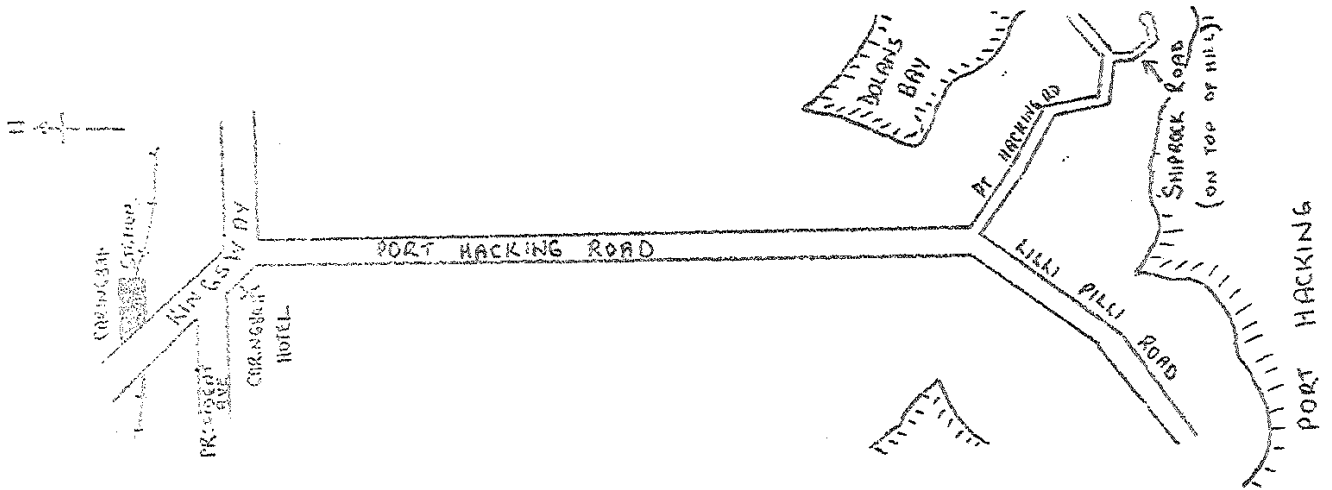

The next Club Meeting will be held on Wednesday, 24th March. This is not the last Wednesday of the month

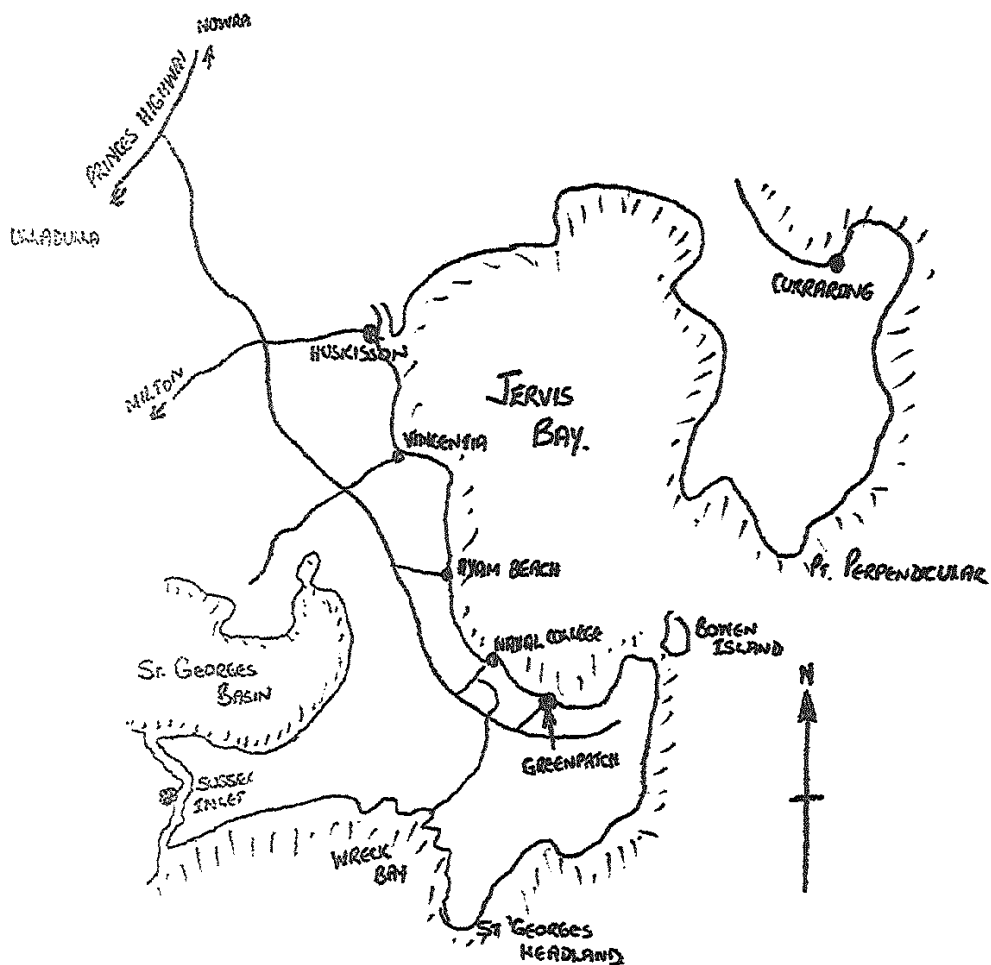

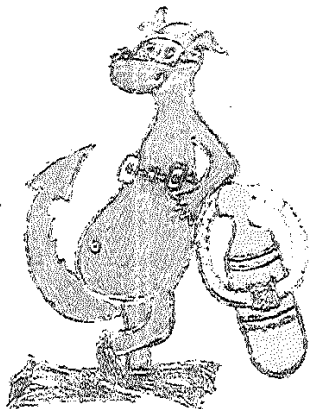


MAP OF SHIPROCK AREA

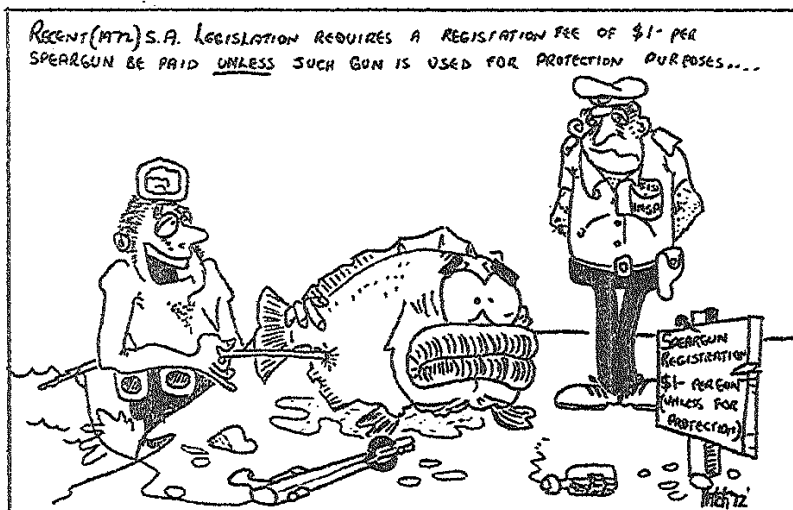

Next meeting - Wednesday, 26th May.

DIVES

The first dive this month will be held at Bass Point, on Sunday 2nd May at 9.00 am. We are hoping that conditions will be more favourable than they have been on past occasions. There are barbecues there so don't forget to bring your lunch. If you do not know where it is, drive down to Shellharbour, south of Wollongong, then follow the signs - you can't miss it.

The next dive will be another night dive at Shiprock. This will be held on Tuesday evening 18th May at 6.45 pm. You must be in the water by 6.45 then - a bit earlier if possible. Be there no later than 6.30 and get geared up.

The trawler has been booked again for Sunday, 30th May at Greenpatch. Cost is \$5.00 per head, preferably payable in advance. There will be another meeting before this, so you can pay then or at any of the club outings. Get in early and make sure you've got a spot.

Please do not forget the Bowling Competition against St. George Spearfishing Club on Friday night, 30th April, 7.30 pm. at Rockdale Bowl. It's good inexpensive fun (approx. \$2.50 for two games including shoes) and there are trophies worth about \$30.00 to be won. We have prepared some notes entitled 'An Introduction to Marine Biology' which are available for .50¢ per set. These notes were prepared from a notebook published by the A.U.F., and sold to those attending the Marine Biology Course in February this year. They deal mainly with the classification of Marine Invertebrates into phyla or basic groups. They are followed by a table to enable you to classify simply, these animals for yourselves, so that you can learn to appreciate more, the life forms that surround you in the sea.

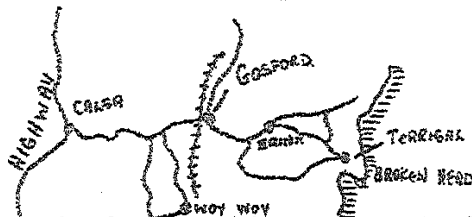
DIVES

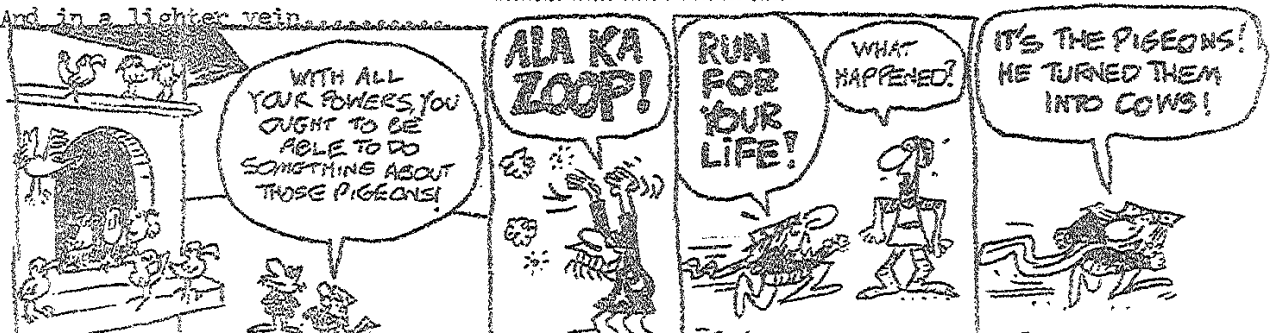

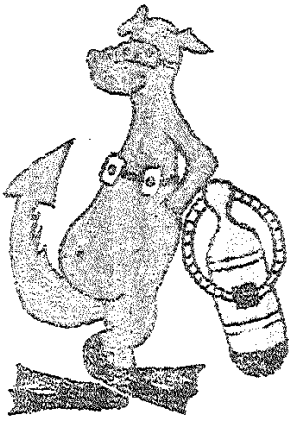

DIVES.

The following is a list of dives covering the period until mid-October.

Don't forget the club raffle. \$1.00 per ticket. We would like to finish this before the Christmas party.

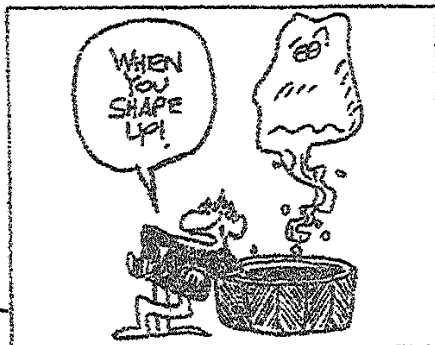
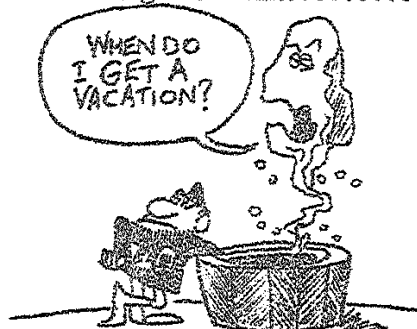

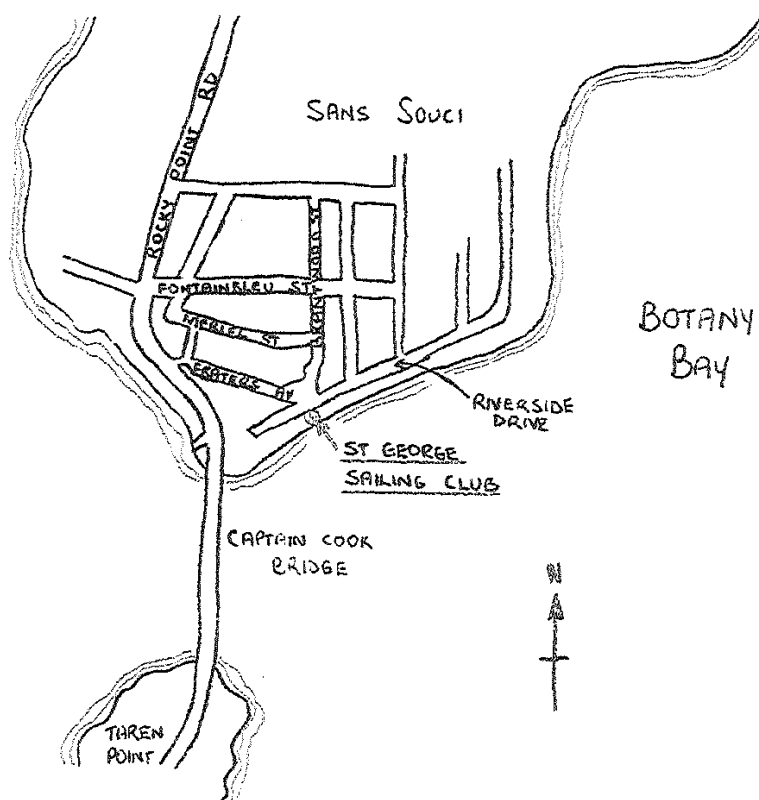
Commencing in January, 1977, Club meetings will be held at the ST GEORGE SAILING CLUB Riverside Drive, Sans Souci (see map below).

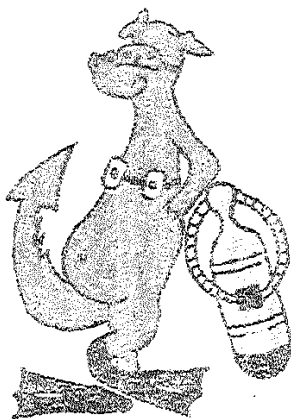

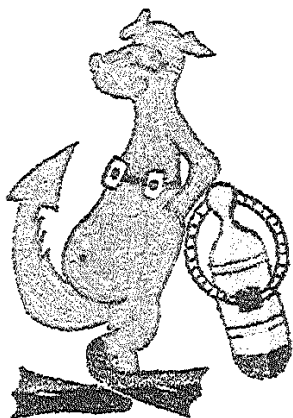
