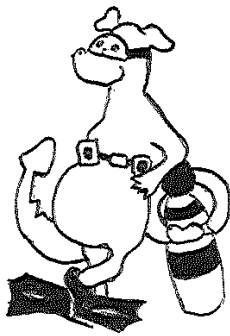

15th July. Shiprock. As usual good turnout and good diving, followed by refreshments at Woronora RSL.

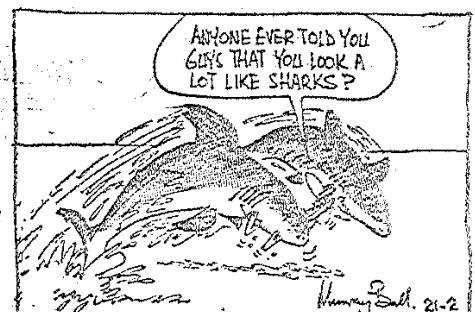
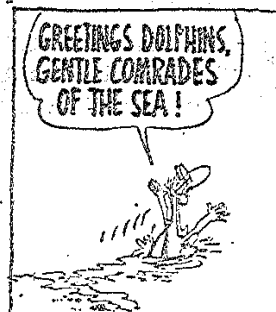

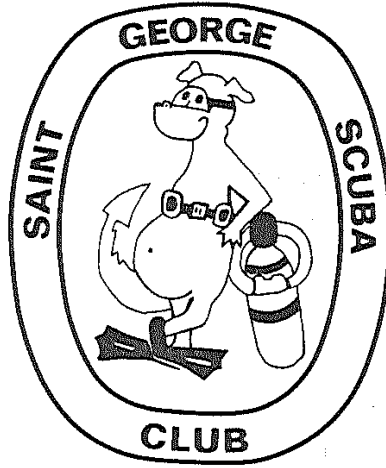

December 8th. Christmas Party 4pm. Salad provided. Bring a steak or similar for the BBQ, we will supply the beer.

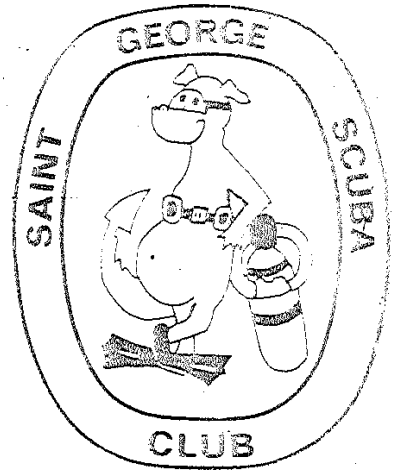
Newsflash
